- Pick up our Human Trafficking Prayer Calendar monthly in the Crossroads Resource Center
- Start a prayer group that meets regularly
- Be on a prayer team for friends/family who are on a short or long term mission trip that focuses on trafficking or injustice
- Pray for victims to be rescued, restored, and redeemed
- Pray for traffickers to be transformed by Christ’s love and leave this life of sin
- Pray for organizations that are seeking to rescue and restore victims
- Pray for governments to stop perpetuating the problem and start upholding their laws

Mobilize

- Lobby local policy makers. Indiana laws are currently not as effective as other states that are raising awareness and fighting human trafficking
- Hold a fundraiser event to raise awareness and donate the funds to an anti-trafficking organization

- Encourage your local schools to partner with students and include the issue of modern day slavery as part of the curriculum. As a parent, educator, or school administrator, be aware of how traffickers target school-aged children
- If you are a student, consider doing one of your research papers on a topic concerning human trafficking
- Purchase items made by human trafficking survivors as gifts and share the story with the recipient. Many items are available for purchase in the Crossroads Resource Center.
